# The Speakers



Gordana Djurovic is a full professor on the Faculty of Economics, University of Montenegro, Podgorica, where she teaches Economic Development, International Economic Relations, Regional economy and the EU Enlargement Policy. Prof. Djurovic was Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for European Integration in Montenegrin Government (2004-2010), when she was chief negotiator for SAA negotiation and WTO accession, NIPAC and coordinated CEFTA 2006 negotiations. She is author of twenty books and chapters in books related to sustainable economic development and EU integration process and more than 70 scientific papers. She is Jean Monnet professor and president of the Montenegrin Pan-European Union (MPEU) and member of the IPEU Presidency.



Karl von Habsburg completed his studies at the private IMADEC University in Vienna with the academic degree of Master of Business Administration (MBA), Business Law (MLE) and Law (LL.M). He is president of Paneuropa Movement Austria and serves as president of Blue Shield. The media entrepreneur is member of several international organisations. From 1996 to 1999 he was Member of European Parliament.



Michael Spindelegger has extensive experience in international relations through his work in the Federal Government of the Republic of Austria. From 2008 to 2013 he served as Minister of Foreign Affairs and from 2013 to 2014 as Minister of Finance. Additionally, he was Vice Chancellor and leader of the Austrian People's Party (ÖVP) from 2011 to 2014. In January 2016 he was appointed Director General of the International Centre for Migration Policy Development (ICMPD).



Daniela Irrera is associate professor of International Relation at the Department of Political and Social Sciences, where she serves as Deputy Director for Research and Internationalisation. She is Chair of the ECPR Standing Group on International Relations, member of the ISA Governing Council, President of the European Peace Research Association, Secretary General of the Italian Political Science Association, associate editor of the Journal of Contemporary European Studies.



Marko Savić is PhD candidate and Teaching Assistant at the Faculty of Political Science, University of Montenegro. His main scientific areas of interest are international relations, geopolitics, questions of power in international relations. He is also experienced public policy researcher and policy analyst with demonstrated history of working in domestic NGOs and international organizations (UN, OSCE, ENEMO).



Miloš Radonjić holds a Master of Arts (MA) degree in international relations (University of Bologna). He is a head of Division for EU political affairs in the European Integration Office, which is a coordination body of the European integration process of Montenegro. He is a secretary of the Working groups for negotiating chapters 23 – Judiciary and Fundamental Rights and 24 – Justice, Freedom and Security, and a member of the Rule of Law Council.



Teodora Ladjic holds M.A. in European studies - governance and regulation (University of Bonn, Germany). She is project manager in the Montenegrin Pan-European Union and Secretary of the Youth section.



Rainhard Kloucek is secretary general of Paneuropa Movement Austria, editor in chief of the magazine „Paneuropa“ and member of the IPEU Presidency.



Gordan Akrap graduated at Zagreb Faculty of Electronics and Computing in 1994. In 2011 he received a PhD at the University of Zagreb, in the field of Information and Communication sciences. He had an active role in Homeland war. During his career in diplomatic and security structures of Croatia he completed a number of professional courses, including Diplomatic Academy. He is active in research of national and regional security, intelligence and history of Homeland War. He published a number of books, and papers in journals and proceedings.
